Instruction from IT/College Administration on the access and use of computer and classroom equipment was adequate



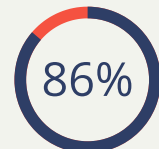
Orientation to access and use of media and learning resources (i.e. Canvas, Cengage, etc.) was adequate



Training on computer and classroom equipment is available when needed



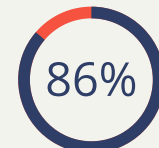
IT support for media services, classroom equipment and computer equipment is adequate
